


The history of ASF in Lithuania

Two ASF-positive wild boars confirmed on 24 of January 2014.








The 1st hunted 5 km from the border with Belarus.

The 2nd found dead about 40 km north from the border with Belarus.

The distance between the two cases was about 36 km.

Evolution of ASF in Lithuania in WB







ASF 2014-2022

4,365 places with 8,061 wild boar

- 6,406 found dead
- 1,655 hunted



ASF strategy in WB

Wild boar management: long term strategy

Hunting all year round
Official controlBan on feeding, baiting allowedActive patrolling to find and destroy carcasses
Passive and active surveillance
Biosecurity in hunting clubs
Incentives for reporting (30 Eur.)

Biosecurity and Management of wild boars



OPEN/CLOSED FACILITIES



- Updated Veterinary and sanitary rules during a hunt (valid since January 2019):
 - Approval of the hunted animal dressing places and facilities,
 - ✓ offal storage in the pits,
 - Minimal biosecurity requirements.
- All 931 hunters clubs are inspected by official veterinarians.
- Regular trainings for hunters are provided.










Consequences of ASF in WB





High number of WB found dead Population decreasing in infected areas Additional work for hunters •Searching carcases •Destroying WB





Consequences of ASF in WB





Destruction of hunted positive wild boars Waiting time before negative results are received.



Investments in biosecurity





Challenges we are facing

The WB population has been increasing since 2020


The number of wild boar positive by PCR increasing – active circulation of virus again! The hunters do not accept targeted hunting of females or regulation of the wild boar population



STATE FOOD AND VETERINARY SERVICE

07/07/2022: ASF was confirmed in a noncommercial farm, almost after two years since the last confirmed outbreak.

- 15 outbreaks
 - 12 non-commercial (46 pigs).
 - 3 commercial farms (2,202 pigs).







ASF in domestic pigs

Control & preventive measures in domestic pigs

Inspection is performed by official veterinarians.

Passive surveillance in DP commercial and non-commercial farms.

Strict biosecurity measures should be implemented and controlled.

Same criteria for commercial pig farms as for non-commercial farms with. Additionally, the following criteria:

• Fencing of holdings, registration of all visitors, production area must be separated from the rest of the holding area, etc.

•The biosecurity plan and farm contingency plan needs to be approved by veterinary services according to the profile of a farm and national legislation. This biosecurity plan should include detailed procedures on disinfection and hygiene of the personnel.

Trainings for official veterinarians and pig keepers.







ASF perspectives in Lithuania

In wild boar

- To eradicate ASF, not to live with a disease
- Continue communication with hunters
- Unscheduled inspections on hunting grounds in cooperation with environment protection services
- National action plan on the management of wild porcine animals in the context of ASF prevention & eradication

In domestic pigs

Stay focused on official control

- More efforts to train biosecurity inspectors
- Implementation of biosecurity on farms
- Keep high awareness
- Trainings and simulation exercise
- Transmission of the ASF virus into pig farms is not fully clear and further research is needed.
